In 2024, Hope For The Warriors (HOPE) prepared for change. Still, our mission remained the same: to **deliver unparalleled services that uplift individuals and their families as they navigate the complexities of military life.**



We started updating our branding this year and launched a new logo in early 2025. Our goal was to unveil new branding that honors our past, strengthens our present, and shapes our future. We went with a design where the word “HOPE” stood firm at the core and chose branding that matched the strength and power of those we serve. We kept patriotic elements alive in our brand with the star and red, white, and blue colors. These changes represent who we are and the HOPE we bring.

Since 2006, Hope For The Warriors has evolved to meet the emergent needs of the military community. What began as bedside care, standing beside post-9/11 military families in the most critical moments of tragedy, has shifted to a continuum of services that address current needs. Many of today’s post-9/11 veterans never saw combat, yet they still face PTSD, suicidality, homelessness, financial strain, isolation, and other challenges.

In 2024, we continued to see a **growth in the need for our services, with a 23% increase in unique clients served from the previous year.** We have seen an elevation of those facing food insecurity and the risk of homelessness, eviction, or foreclosure. We will continue to meet these needs with the genuine support of our dedicated investors, which allow HOPE the flexibility to develop tailored solutions for the unique needs of each person, family, and community.

We are committed to fostering resilience and a sense of purpose, ensuring that those who have served our nation will thrive. Together, we forge a strong community that champions courage, commitment, and grit.

Courage Partner \$10/month

Provide essential materials for a military or veteran caregiver to learn how to lower the effects of stress through mind-body techniques and skill-building exercises.
